ABOUT

Pioneers Go East Collective is a New York based award-winning collective of intergenerational thought-provoking artists and activists in residence at La MaMa and Judson Church. Since 2010, Pioneers Go East Collective empowers the voices of LGBTQ and Feminist artists for social change.

The Collective has been an incubator of 14 theatre and dance works, produced over 10 series and arts festivals, and presented more than 400 artists to date. We create platforms of inclusion that link audiences in all five boroughs and in communities of New York State, through personal storytelling that blends heartfelt, humorous experiences infused with joy and high-energy.

The Collective presents an annual season of immersive contemporary performances and video-art. STARS is a cycle of experiential performances. NEXT PIONEERS program offers workshops, mentoring, and internship opportunities. CROSSROADS SERIES and NEW WORKS: OUT-FRONT! are two ongoing curated series at Judson Church and The Exponential Festival.
